Ingredients:

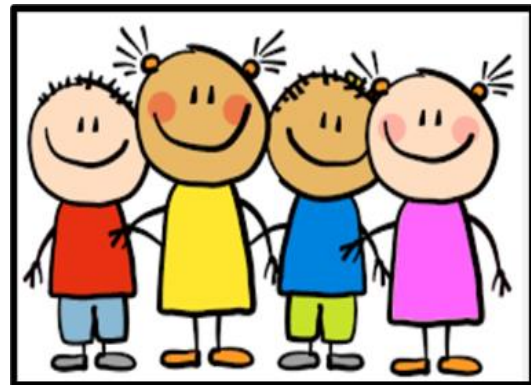
- Puffed rice
- Tamarind chutney- 1 tsp
- Coriander chutney - 1 tsp (optional)
- Chopped boiled potato, tomato, cucumber (1 table spoon each)
- Chopped coriander - for garnishing
- Sev (gram flour fritters) - as required
- Boiled or roasted ground nuts - as required
- Pomegranate- 1 table spoon
- Salt, pepper, chaat masala (to taste)

Procedure:

Take a big bowl and a spoon. Add puffed rice, potatoes, tomatoes, cucumber, sev, ground nuts and pomegranate. Having mixed the above, add coriander chutney and tamarind chutney along with salt, pepper, and chaat masala. Mix well again. Garnish with coriander leaves. Our tasty healthy bhel is ready!
