Culinary Delight

Strawberry Banana Smoothie



Ingredients:

- 1 cup fresh strawberries
- 1 ripe banana, peeled and sliced
- 1 cup yoghurt (plain or flavoured)
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1-2 tablespoons honey or maple syrup

Procedure:

- 1. Wash the strawberries thoroughly. Remove the stems, and cut them into halves.
- 2. Peel the banana and slice it into smaller pieces.
- 3. In a blender, combine the sliced strawberries, banana and yoghurt.
- 4. Add milk to the blender.

 Adjust the quantity based on your desired smoothie thickness.
- 5. If you prefer a sweeter taste, add honey or maple syrup while blending.
